Many patrons who love e-books are familiar with Overdrive. Oftentimes, there are requests for a wider selection of titles.




With that in mind, Clearview Library District is happy to announce that patrons may now borrow e-books from the new collection. Axis 360. Axis 360 is a digital media library, offering

State-of-the Art Self-Check Kiosks!

The Clearview Library District is excited to announce the arrival of the new self-check kiosks! These self-check machines are easier to use and offer more functionality, better efficiency, and are much more compatible with today's constantly evolving technology than our older self-check kiosks. You already may have noticed the two new self-check kiosks near the entrance at the circulation area, and one in the children's area.

New features include the ability for patrons to pay fines at the self-check kiosk using cash or a credit card. The touch interface allows patrons to check their account and their hold requests, as well as print out receipts or receive email receipts. The new self-checks can scan multiple items at once (we recommend 5 maximum), which is a big improvement over our previous system which only allowed one item to be checked out one at a time. In addition, patrons are able to return books themselves using the two self-check kiosks nearest the front.

With any new technology, there are bound to be a few bugs in the system, and the Library is grateful that our patrons remain patient as they get ironed out. However, the staff here at the Clearview Library District are confident that patrons will love the new, easy-to-use self-check kiosks just as much as they do! As always, if there are any questions, simply ask somebody on staff to demonstrate how to use our new self-check kiosks, and they will be happy to help!

Tax Help



Every Monday at the Library through April 14, from 4 - 7 pm, the VITA/TCE Tax Assistance program will be offering a free tax preparation service available to

low and middle income taxpayers (under \$50,000 of income or over 60 years of age). Returns are prepared by IRS Certified Volunteers. Reservations are not accepted.

This program is not hosted by the Library; any questions need to be asked in person at the Monday night tax preparation program.

The Library has received Colorado Individual Income Tax forms and some Federal forms, including 1040, 1040EZ and 1040A. Additional Federal forms and booklets will be made available for pick up at the Library. Keep in mind that the Library does not receive all forms.
