

Library Policies Get Updated.

At the Sept. 25th meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Clearview Library District, the Conduct in the Library Policy was reviewed and revised. The Library Board regularly reviews policies and updates them as necessary. The Conduct Policy came under review due to an incident which occurred in the Library on August 20th when a patron reported seeing a woman in the Children's area with a gun. The woman was asked to take her weapon to her vehicle or leave the library. The woman chose to leave. She did however contact her employer, the Rocky Mountain Gun Owners, who sent a letter to the Library threatening a lawsuit unless the Library changed its policy at the Board meeting on Aug. 28th. The agenda for the Aug. 28th meeting had already been set and the Board had no time to thoroughly review the policy. The review was scheduled for the September 25th meeting.

What was the issue? The language of the former policy stated that "weapons are not allowed" in the Library. Colorado Law permits concealed carry with a permit unless security gates and guards are available to take weapons from all people who enter. The Library was not taking a stand against Colorado law; the language of the former policy was imprecise. The revised policy clearly states that "Open Carrying" is not permitted.

There were a few other items in the Policy which needed updating. For example, smoking is now prohibited within 30 feet of the entrance and e-cigarettes as well as marijuana are not allowed. Bicycles, skateboards and scooters need to be left outside the building. You can view the entire policy on the website, on the "About" tab.

We want to thank all of our loyal patrons for their support during the past month, especially those who spoke or sent written comment to the Library Board. The Staff will continue to make every effort to make your Library visit pleasant and safe.

the Library. This IPad is dedicated to Zinio magazines and nothing else! Just perform a search, touch the magazine you want to read and enjoy reading by the fireplace.








