The terms "Make" and "maker" gained popularity in the early 2000s, as Make Magazine began publication and their staff began hosting gatherings of digital and analog crafters, tinkerers and hackers. These events, known as Maker Faires, have sprung up all over the world, with the White House declaring the week of June 12th the National Week of Makers.

The DigiLAB, a digital makerspace implemented a short time ago, will continue to change and evolve as we better understand our patrons wants and needs.

As a part of better understanding those needs, the Library will be hosting multiple input sessions between now and the Northern Colorado Mini Maker Faire (Oct. 10-11) to gauge patrons' interest in future maker programming and what the Library makerspace should include and focus on. 

Growing Readers
