

The Library could not function without the dedicated service provided by the Library Board. Did you know that they are all volunteers? These amazing people spend countless hours serving the Library and its patrons.

The Clearview Library District is governed by a six member Board of Trustees that sets policy, oversees finances, and hires a library director to handle the operation of the library district. Board members are appointed, with the approval of the school board and town board, to serve three year terms with a limit of two consecutive terms.

Trustees must reside within the library district that shares the same boundaries as the Weld Re4 school district.

Let's meet a few of them:





April is Volunteer month. With that in mind, I volunteer these fantastic facts: The **Salvation Army** has approximately 3.5 million volunteers registered within the U.S., while over 1.2 million people volunteer for the **American Red Cross** on an annual basis. The **United Way** had more than one million people volunteering last year. 531,909 Volunteers lead the various **YMCAs** and are central to their mission, ensuring each Y meets the unique needs of its own community.

America's top volunteer is **Clara Barton**. Born Clarissa Harlowe Barton (December 25, 1821 – April 12, 1912), Clara is one of the most honored women in all of American history. She risked her life bringing supplies and support to soldiers during the Civil War. And, in 1881, at age 60, she founded the American Red Cross. Her deep understanding of the needs of people in need and her concern for the ways in which she could help them guided her throughout all of her life.






